# Welcome to Darwin



## How to get to the city

- Follow the shaded sea walk to the Darwin Waterfront Precinct and take the glass elevator and sky-bridge to the city centre (approximately 15 minutes)
- Or catch the user-pays shuttle bus from the cruise terminal directly to the Visitor Information Centre (a 5 minute ride). Both options are wheelchair accessible

## Visitor Information Centre

- Book last minute tours and find out more about tropical Darwin
- Various short tours depart throughout the day

## Supermarkets and bottle shops

- Coles Supermarket on Mitchell Street
- Woolworths Supermarket on Smith Street
- Please bring your identification if you are planning to purchase alcohol

## Darwin Waterfront Precinct

- Cafes and restaurants with alfresco dining
- Enjoy a swim at the saltwater Recreation Lagoon or at the Wave Lagoon (no crocodiles here!)

## Food and drink

- Restaurants available at the Darwin Waterfront Precinct, throughout the city centre and in Cullen Bay
- You're guaranteed fresh - with barramundi, mud crab and other NT seafood common on menus
- Dishes here are often prepared with Thai, Malaysian and Indonesian influences
- Darwin's Greek, Indian and Aboriginal heritage also shines through in its food

## Shopping at Smith Street Mall and Casuarina Square shopping centre

- Smith St Mall: shops, souvenir stores, pharmacies, ATMs and money exchangers
- Star Village (small arcade off the Smith Street Mall) with boutique shopping options
- Casuarina Square: over 190 fashion, homeware and lifestyle stores. Located 15 kilometres from the cruise terminal; accessible via taxi (approximately 20 minutes) or public bus (Route 10, approximately 35 minutes)

## Aboriginal art and culture

- Local Aboriginal people are the Larrakia people
- Larrakia Nation operate a shop front with information in the Smith Street Mall
- Find some treasure to take home at an Aboriginal art gallery in the city or get a broad overview of local art at the Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory in Fannie Bay
